

CARRIGAFOYLE AND KILCAVAN KIN**GENERATIONS 9 & 8.**

Your Carrigafoyle and Kilcavan kin descend from **William** (A 0907) through his elder son **Lancelot** (A0801) of Carrigafoyle and his younger brother John (A 0802) of Kilcavan.

GENERATION 7.**Issue of Lancelot Sandes of Carrigafoyle (A 0801) and Margaret Stoughton:**

For details of William of Carrigafoyle (A 0701) see Annexure A.

Issue of John Sandes of Kilcavan (A 0802) and Ann:

Lancelot of Kilcavan (0701) was probably born not later than about 1685; indeed, if he was the eldest son he would have been born not later than 1671. He, or possibly his cousin Lancelot (0601), was MP for Portarlinton, Queens County, from 1715 to 1727. He was party to a lease in 1720 and a deed in 1727, the latter probably to do with the marriage articles of his son Pigott (0606) and Susanna Warren. From a further deed of 1745, to do with the marriage articles of himself and Elizabeth his widow, by whom he had no children, he married her on 5 March 1707, and must have died by 1745. There is no record of the mother of his two sons.

Richard (0702) was born at Kilcavan in 1671. In 1685 he was admitted to Trinity College, Dublin, but is not known to have graduated. He was buried at St Michans, Dublin in 1697.

William (0703) and George (0704) were also buried at St Michans, in 1685 and 1694 respectively.

GENERATION 6.

Issue of William Sandes of Carrigafoyle (A 0701) and Mary Coward:

Lancelot of Carrigafoyle (0601) was a Captain in the Army, and may have been MP for Portarlington as above. In 1716 he was named as life beneficiary of lands at Ballymalis and Killbonane, Co Kerry, under a fine levied by his father and his brother William. He was party to deeds in 1720, 1721 and 1727, concerning lands at Hartstowne, Coatstowne, Saraghstowne and Galberstowne, Co Meath. On 4 May 1721 he married Margaret, third daughter of David Crosbie of Ardfert by Jane Hamilton of Liscloony, Kings County, by whom he had three daughters. He died in 1727, and in 1731 his widow was married to George Green of Old Abbey, Co Limerick.

William (0602) was party to the above fine of 1716, under which the lands granted to his brother Lancelot, and after to his male heirs, reverted to himself and his heirs as life beneficiaries. He was also party to the deed of 1720 above. He married Jane (or Dorothea?), daughter of Dr Thomas Smyth, Bishop of Limerick, but died without issue in 1721.

Margaret (0603) was married to Pierce Crosbie, son of Sir Thomas Crosbie of Rusheen, Co Kerry. Pierce was born in 1684, was educated at Trinity Coilege, Dublin, and was a barrister of the Middle Temple, London. They were named in the fine of 1716 as beneficiaries with their heirs after William and his heirs. Margaret had three children.

Katherine (0604) was married to Maurice Crosbie of Ballykealey, Co Kerry. They and their heirs were also named as beneficiaries in the fine of 1716, after Margaret and Pierce Crosbie.

Elizabeth (0605) was married to Arthur Crosbie of Tubrid, Co Kerry. She and her heirs were also named as beneficiaries of the fine of 1716.

Issue of Lancelot Sandes of Kilcavan (0701):

Pigott of Kilcavan (0606) married Susanna Warren, by whom he had one son. In 1727 they were party to a deed probably concerning their marriage articles, to do with lands in King's County, and in Kilcavan and Garrymore in Queen's County.

Richard (0607) was party in 1730 with his brother to an assignment of lands of Dysert and others in the Pigott family.

GENERATION 5.

Issue of Lancelot Sandes of Carrigafoyle (0601) and Margaret Crosbie:

Mary Dorothea of Carrigafoyle (0501) was married to her cousin Lancelot of Kilcavan (0504), by whom she had one or two sons and two daughters. She was living in 1758.

Jane (0502) died unmarried.

Catherine (0503) was married to George Rose of Morgans and Mount Prospect, Co Limerick, by whom she had issue, and was living in 1758. She may also have been married to Maurice Crosbie of Ballykealey, who died aged 80 on 2 November 1761, and by him had issue, but there may be confusion over the similar marriage by Katherine (0604). A portrait of her by Nathaniel Hone, probably done in the late 1750s, was owned by the late Major Mervyn Sandys.

Issue of Pigott Sandes of Kilcavan (0606) and Susanna Warren:

Lancelot of Kilcavan (0504) married Mary Dorothea of Carrigafoyle (0501), having by her one or two sons and two daughters. He was living in 1758.

GENERATION 4.Issue of Lancelot Sandes of Kilcavan (0504) and Mary Dorothea Sandes of Carrigafoyle (0501):

George (0401) may have been the eldest son as recorded by the register of Trinity College, Dublin, but not elsewhere. He was admitted to the college in November 1767 and received his BA in 1772.

Lancelot Charles of Carrigafoyle and of Kilcavan (0402) married in 1787 Sarah, daughter of John Croker of Ballinagarde, Co Limerick, by whom he had four sons and a daughter.

Catherine (0403) was married to The Hon Robert Fitzgerald, 16th Knight of Kerry. She may have been born about 1722, but the date looks unlikely.

Margaret (0404) was married to The Rev Francis Hewson on 22 September 1773 at Ennismore, Co Kerry.

GENERATION 3.Issue of Lancelot Charles Sandes of Carrigafoyle and of Kilcavan (0402) and Sarah Croker:

Charles Lancelot (0301) of Carrigafoyle, of Kilcavan and Indiaville, Queen's County, and of Morgans, Co Limerick, married in 1815 Mary, only sister of Sir Charles Coote Bt of Ballyfin, Queen's County, by whom he had two sons and three daughters. He was a Captain in the Scots Fusilier Guards. In 1867 he sold the Carrigafoyle and Kilcavan estates, except for Carrigafoyle Castle.

George (0302) of Dunowen, Co Cork, married Mary, daughter of Lt Gen Croker, by whom he had four daughters.

William (0303) married Elizabeth Copley.

Henry Lancelot (0304) was born in 1805. In 1831 he was admitted to Trinity College, Dublin, where he received his BA in 1835. He then joined the clergy, became Rector of Ballycuchane, and married Jane, daughter of James Magill.

Mary (0305) was married to Richard Condon.

GENERATION 2.

Issue of Charles Lancelot Sandes of Carrigafoyle and Kilcavan (0301) and Mary Coote:

Charles of Carrigafoyle and Morgans, and of Clontarf, Co Dublin (0201) was a JP and a Captain in the 89th (Princess Victoria's) Regiment of Foot, later The Royal Irish Regiment. In 1842 he married Isabella Georgina, daughter of Ralph Carr of Cocken Hall, Co Durham, by whom he had three sons. In 1856 he married secondly Mildred, only daughter of William Brown of Spring Mount, Co Limerick, by whom he had six children. He was a well known dog breeder and also coursed greyhounds.

Henry Ralph (0202) was born in 1829. In 1846 he was admitted to Trinity College, Dublin, but did not apparently graduate.

Elizabeth Anne (0203) was married to Henry Trench of Glenmalire, Queen's County, in 1838.

Mary Sarah (0204) was married to Lewis Moore of Cremorgan, Queen's County.

Issue of George Sandes of Dunowen (0302) and Mary Croker:

Honorah Sarah (0205) was married to Richard Welsted.

Sarah Charity (0206) died unmarried.

Catherine (0207) was married to Thomas Hungerford.

Charity Jane (0208) died unmarried.

GENERATION 1.

Issue of Charles Sandes of Carrigafoyle, Morgans and Clontarf (0201) and Isabella Carr:

Lancelot Charles (0101) was born on 19 April 1846, and with his brothers emigrated to USA about 1880-85. He married Emma Appleton by whom he had six children. At one time he was living in Omaha, Nebraska. See also Annexure H, about his possible time in the British army.

Ralph George (0102) was born in 1847, and William Henry (0103) in 1849. Ralph returned from USA to Ireland and practised as a solicitor in Belfast.

Issue of Charles Sandes of Carrigafoyle, Morgans and Clontarf (0201) and Mildred Brown:

Charles Francis (0104) was born in 1860, and was a JP.

Mildred Ida (0105) was married in 1880 to Norman Sands Spencer-Black of Craigmaddie, Scotland.

Mary Constance (0106) was married in 1884 to Samuel Boxwell of Blackrock, Co Dublin, by whom she had a son, William Sandes Boxwell. William, who lived at East Molesey, Surrey, in the 1920s, possessed portraits of **William** (A 0907) and **Lancelot** (A 0801), which have yet to be traced.

Elizabeth Rose (0107) was married to His Honour Judge Brown KC.

Isabella Mauraithe (0108) was married to The Rev Robert W Ronayne MA.

Dora (0109) was married to Gerald Fitzgerald King.

GENERATION 0.

Issue of Lancelot Charles Sandes (0101) and Emma Appleton:

Charles Lancelot (0001) had one son.

Charles William (0002).

Douglas (0003).

Robert Dalrymple (0004) married Ruby Hilda Lamb, by whom he had five children.

Margery (0005) was married to David Usher Barnwell DFC, missing believed killed in action over Malta in 1941.

GENERATION -1.

Issue of Charles Lancelot Sandes (0001):

Michael Hume (-0101) was a Cdr RN.

Issue of Robert Dalrymple Sandes (0004) and Ruby Hilda Lamb:

Lancelot Dalrymple (-0105) served in the Royal Tank Regiment and in the Royal Air Force, and was awarded the DFC.

Robin (-0106) was born in 1915 and lived for many years in South Africa, where I contacted him in the phone book in Capetown. He married Audrey by whom he had two children. He died in September 1990 at Limington, Somerset.

Raymond Horatio (-0107) served in the Royal Engineers in 1942-43 with 51 London Division from El Alamein to Trieste. In 1948 he transferred to the Royal Army Service Corps, retiring in 1953. He married Margaret Miriam Duncan, by whom he had a son.
